

Questions & Answers:

Q: Above the ballroom area the borrowed lite metal frame are they getting painted?

A: All storefronts connected to the ballroom will Not be painted, that includes the 4th floor storefronts from the hallway to the ballroom (both sides), and the doors and storefronts on the third floor between the hallway and the ballroom. The storefront from the hallway into room 307 and the hallway into meeting room 306 will need to be painted (both sides). Please note the columns in the 4th floor corridor 415 will need to be painted on the corridor and the ballroom side, the contractor is responsible for painting the upper columns between the storefronts and the entire east facing double height wall.

Q: What is the color, Style, and Manufacturer of the Carpet Tile?

A: Per section 096510 – 2.3 Resilient Tile "Flocked" Floor Covering:

C. Manufacturer: "Forbo Flotex"

H. Style and Color: as selected by architect from Manufacturers full range.

Q: What is the pattern of the linoleum?

A: Per section 096510 – 2.1 Linoleum Tile Floor Covering:

- J. Colors: as selected by architect from manufacturer's full range.
 - 1. Patterns: Provide up to five colors per room, in proportions as required to produce custom, random, and curvilinear patterns from artwork to be supplied by Architect.

To clarify it is expected that there will be a maximum of 3 colors used throughout a single room, pattern is expected to be a randomized "Brick" pattern using 2 main colors with a possible accent. Final design will be provided to Contractor prior to start of constructed.


Changes to the Bid Form:



 Add Unit Cost No 2 – Add to or deduct the cost to paint all sides of an existing door, one coat primer and three coats paint, in accordance with the bid documents.

Clarifications:

- Per Spec Section 011000 Summary "Contractor will be responsible for moving furniture out of existing offices..."
 - The contractor will Not be responsible for removing any TV's, Computers, Monitors, or personal items and boxes, the college will remove all of these from the rooms prior to the start of construction.
 - The contractor is responsible for removing all furniture from offices 401, 402, 403, 404, 405, & 435 out of the offices and into the student union ballroom while construction is taking place, then the contractor will be responsible for returning the furniture to its original locations within these rooms.
 - The contractor will be responsible for removing all furniture from rooms 302, 303, 306, 307, 415, 418 through 434, & 413 and relocating to a designated site on RIC's campus.
- The contractor will be allowed to store materials on site within the student union 3rd and 4th floors, but must do so in a neat and orderly manner, See attached site utilization plan for additional information regarding contractor's use of the site.
- The contractor will be responsible for removing any wall mounted whiteboards, plaques, corkboards, etc... And reinstalling said items after painting is completed.
- Window caulking on the exterior of the building has been tested for asbestos and was tested negative, there is a \$5,000 hazardous materials allowance included in the bid for any additional testing or disposal that may be required.
- The graphics in room 307 will need to be removed by the contractor to paint the walls, the contractor is not responsible for replacing this graphic. The plaques on the wall will need to be removed and rehung after the wall is painted.
- To clarify there are a total of 25 doors on the third floor that are getting painted all sides, all work related to painting these doors is to be included in the base bid. Please also see revised bid form that includes a new Unit Cost per door to paint all sides of the door.

STATE CONTRACT ADDENDUM

The prevailing wage requirements are generally set forth in RIGL 37-13-1 et seq. These requirements refer to the prevailing rate of pay for regular, holiday, and overtime wages to be paid to each craftsmen, mechanic, teamster, laborer, or other type of worker performing work on public works projects when state or municipal funds exceed one thousand dollars (\$1,000).

All Prevailing Wage Contractors and Subcontractors are reguired to:

- I. Submit to the Awarding Authority a list of the contractor's subcontractors for any part or all of the prevailing wage work in accordance with RIGL § 37-13-4;
- 2. Pay all prevailing wage employees at least once per week and in accordance with RIGL §37-13-7 (see Appendix B attached);
- 3. Post the prevailing wage rate scale and the Department of Labor and Training's prevailing wage poster in a prominent and easily accessible place on the work site in accordance with RIGL §37-13-11; posters may be downloaded at www.dlt.ri.gov/pw/Posters.htm .poster/htm or obtained from the Department of Labor and Training, Center General Complex, 1511 Pontiac Avenue, Cranston, Rhode Island;
- 4. Access the Department of Labor and Training website, at www.dlt.ri.gov on or before July 1st of each year, until such time as the contract is completed, to ascertain the current prevailing wage rates and the amount of payment or contributions for each covered prevailing wage employee and make any necessary adjustments to the covered employee's prevailing wage rates effective July Ist of each year in compliance with RIGL §37-13-8;
- Attach a copy of this CONTRACT ADDENDUM and its attachments as a binding obligation to any and all contracts between the contractor and any

- 6. Provide for the payment of overtime for prevailing wage employees who work in excess of eight (8) hours in any one day or forty (40) hours in any one week as provided by RIGL §37-13-10;
- 7. Maintain accurate prevailing wage employee payroll records on a Rhode Island Certified Weekly Payroll form available for download at www.dlt.ri.gov/pw.forms/htm, as required by RIGL §37-13-13, and make those records available to the Department of Labor and Training upon request;
- 8. Furnish the fully executed RI Certified Weekly Payroll Form to the awarding authority on a monthly basis for all work completed in the preceding-month.
- 9. For general or primary contracts one million dollars (\$1,000,000) or more, shall maintain on the work site a fully executed RI Certified Prevailing Wage Daily Log listing the contractor's employees employed each day on the public works site; the RI Certified Prevailing Wage Daily Log shall be available for inspection on the public works site at all times; this rule shall not apply to road, highway, or bridge public works projects. Where applicable, furnish both the Rhode Island Certified Prevailing Wage Daily Log together with the Rhode Island Weekly Certified Payroll to the awarding authority.
- 10. Assure that all covered prevailing wage employees on construction projects with a total project cost of one hundred thousand dollars (\$100,000) or more has a OSHA ten (10) hour construction safety certification in compliance with RIGL § 37-23-1;
- 11. Employ apprentices for the performance of the awarded contract when the contract is valued at one million dollars (\$1,000,000) or more, and comply with the apprentice to journeyperson ratio for each trade approved by the apprenticeship council of the Department of Labor and Training in compliance with RIGL §37-13-3.1;
- 12. Assure that all prevailing wage employees who perform work which requires a Rhode Island trade license possess the appropriate Rhode Island trade license in compliance with Rhode Island law; and

13. Comply with all applicable provisions of RIGL §37-13-1, et. seq;
