Do you have the picture? Each graduate has his own. And in each picture? . . . RIC is re-born.















#### **Digress**


# FINE ARTS SERIES National Ballet



















## **CHRISTMAS BALL**




## WINTER WEEKEND Displays


## **ADMINISTRATION**
