Fall 2021 Enrollment

Overall Enrollment

A total of 6,334 students enrolled at Rhode Island College (RIC) for the fall 2021 semester. This number represents a decrease of 10.4% compared to last fall's **headcount** enrollment 7,072 of students and a 29% decline over ten years. Total **FTE** dropped 10.3% from 5,869 in fall 2020 to 5,266 this fall.

Undergraduate Enrollment

Undergraduate **headcount** enrollment is down 12.4% from last year and 30% since 2012. The number of students enrolled in **degree** programs (5,109) decreased by 13% between 2020 and 2021, while **non-degree** enrollment increased slightly, going from 127 to 146. Undergraduate **FTE** decreased by 12.9% for degree students compared to an 8.5% increase for non-degree seeking students.


Graduate Enrollment

At 1,079, total graduate **headcount** enrollment increased slightly from last fall but is still down by 18% compared to ten years ago. Degree students increased by 30 students compared to last year, while non-degree students decreased by 25. Graduate **FTE** increased by 7.3%.

Enrollment by Degree and FT/PT Status


Undergraduate students comprise 83% of the college's total students, with 97% of students in degree programs. **Graduate** students make up 17% of the student body, and students in degree programs account for 72% of the total headcount.


Full-time **undergraduate** degree candidates are enrolled in an average of 15.0 **credits** this fall. Full-time **graduate** degree students are enrolled in an average of 11.0 credits, and part-time graduate degree students take an average of 5.0 credits.



Demographic Characteristics

Rhode Island residents comprise 86% of RIC's undergraduate student body and 87.1% of graduate students. Over two thirds (68.9%) of undergraduate and 77.8% of graduate students identified as **female**; 27 students did not identify themselves using traditional gender categories. More than three quarters (76.9%) of **undergraduates** are **24 or younger**, while a similar percentage (73.6%) of **graduate** students are **over 25** years old.







Based on students who submitted FAFSA, **First-generation** students account for 45.1% of undergraduates this fall. **Pell eligible** students comprise 43.7% of undergraduates.

This fall 38.6% of RIC's student body identifies as **students of color** (41.4% of **undergraduates** and 25.4% of **graduate** students). Among **students of color**, Hispanic/Latino is the largest group at RIC, representing 23.1% of the total student body (25% of undergraduates). An additional 9.9% of students identify as Black/African American, 3.2% as Asian, 1.9% as Two or more races, 0.4% as American Indian/Alaskan Native, and .03% as Native Hawaiian/Other Pacific Islander. Roughly 55% of students are White, 6.3% of the students did not report their race/ethnicity, and 0.2% are nonresident aliens.

Degree-Seeking Enrollment by School and Level

As illustrated below, Arts & Sciences makes up 46% of **undergraduate degree-seeking** enrollments, followed by Nursing, Education, Business and Social Work. At the **graduate** level, Education programs account for the largest percentage of enrollments in degree programs. Social Work enrolls 28% of graduate students, while the remaining are in Nursing, Arts & Sciences, and Business. In Fall 2021 the % of graduate students in Education increased by 4% while the other areas experienced small decreases or remained the same.
