Once your request is reviewed and decision made, the Associate Dean will send an email. If your request is granted the Associate Dean will enroll you in the course that puts you over the 18-credit limit.

If you choose to drop a course after this process has been completed, you will be unable to enroll in another course if that course places you over the 18-credit limit. You will have to begin this process again.
